Attendance


You have probably noticed the banner outside the school. We are working alongside Cardiff Council to try and get our attendance back to where it was pre-pandemic. We regularly had attendance of 95% each day, currently we are lucky to achieve 90% each day. Please make every effort to send your child to school every day unless they are unwell.



Late in the mornings

This has become a problem again, in many of the Classes. It is extremely disruptive when children are late for the following reasons:

- 1. They miss the vitally important introduction to the day's learning
- 2. The Teacher has to get the Register back out to record the late mark (this stops them from teaching)
- 3. The Dinner register has to be changed (this stops the teacher from teaching)
- 4. Miss Jenkins/ Mrs Chivers/ Mrs Mills has to leave the Office to escort children to their Classroom, particularly if they are in the Foundation Phase. This leaves the Office unstaffed; the telephone and door unanswered and important administration work interrupted.
- 5. Some children receive additional learning interventions from the Teaching
 Assistants, these begin at 8.55, your child would then miss these short but very
 important daily sessions. They cannot be rescheduled as the Teaching Assistants
 work to very tight timetables.

Class One




This week in class one, we have been really busy. We have been looking at the story Oliver's Vegetables. We chose our favourite vegetable and we made our own collages,

and used them to make a pictograph.










our vegetables. We bought our favourite vegetables in our farm shop.


Class Three


We learned the hymn "God's Spirit is in my Heart", a prayer that expresses our belief in the Holy Spirit and the children made prayer cards.



CAD - 3D printing in class 5

In science and technology, we have designed and created 3D models for our Computer Aided Design lessons. We used the website TINKERCAD to design: key rings, door name plates and drink coasters. CLASS 6 WELSH RIVERS



RIVER TAFF:

- The River Taff is located in south-Central Wales.
- The River Taff is 67 km long.
- The mouth of The River Taff is in Cardiff Bay.
- The River Taff is most famous for its name being Taff which in Welsh means Welshmen.
- The River Taff has an abundance of fish such as: salmon, trout, eels, otters and kingfishers.



RIVER SEVERN

- The River Severn is located in the Southwest of Great Britain, specifically in Wales and England.
- The River Severn is 354 Km long
- The mouth of the River Severn is at the Bristol Channel.
- The depth of the River Severn can vary, reaching depths of 30 metres.



RIVER TEIFI

- The River Teifi is located in Wales, specifically in Ceredigion and Carmarthenshire.
- The River Teifi is 122 Km long.
- The deepest point of the River Teifi is 455m
- Salmon, trout, otters and various bird species live in and around this river.
- The River Teifi is famous for exceptional fishing, particularly for salmon and for sea and brown trout.



- The River Wye is in the Cambrian Mountains, Pumlumon, in Mid Wales.
- The River Wye is 250 km long.
- The mouth of the River Wye is the Severn



Estuary in England.

- The deepest point is about 15 metres.
- The River Wye is suffering from a heavy form of pollution.
- The River Wye is most famous for its stunning scenery, rich wildlife, and historical significance

RIVER USK

- It is located in south West Wales.
- It is 120 km long
- The mouth of the Usk begins in Newport
- It is full of salmon, trout, shad, lampreys and eels.

RIVER DEE

- The River Dee is located in North Wales and runs into England.
- The River Dee is 112 km long.
- The mouth of the River Dee is the Dee Estuary.
- The River Dee is only a shallow river being on average 4 metres deep.
- The River Dee has lots of life including salmon, lamprey, and freshwater pearl mussels.
- The River Dee is most famous for its exceptional Salmon fishing.

RIVER CONWY

- The River Conwy is located in Northern Wales.
- The River Conwy is 43 km long.
- The River Conwy's Mouth is the Irish sea.
- It is up to is 15 meters deep in places.
- The River boasts a wide selection of fish and birds such as: salmon, sea trout, and brown trout.
 In addition to fish, the river is also a habitat for birds, insects, and mammals like otters.

RIVER RHYMNEY

- The River Rhymney is located in South Wales.
- It is 48 km long.
- It's mouth is the Bristol Channel.
- Its deepest point is 23 km deep.
