





Bullying VS Banter

Banter:

There is a fine line between bullying and sharing banter. Make sure that you know the difference.

You can only Share banter with somebody That you know.

You:

'I bet you can't beat me in a race I'm so much faster than you hahaha.'

Your friend:

I LOVE your hair today it looks really cute.

Having a joke with your friends is ok because that is banter.

If you are sharing negative comments with someone who is not a close friend and you're doing it every day then this is **BULLYING not BANTER!**

My advice to everybody is to stop saying negative comments to people and to always be kind!
