






About his Globe theatre, his life and his plays. By Hallie-Mae and Ruby-Lou, Class 5









William Shakespeare was a famous writer who is known for his plays. He was born in England in April 1564 and died at the age 52 because he became ill on March 23 1616. He got married to Anne Hathaway when Shakespeare was 18 and she was 26 in November 1582. Shakespeare had 6 siblings and his mum and dad were Mary Shakespeare John Shakespeare. When Shakespeare was younger he struggled to spell so it took him a while to learn to write all of these plays. William Shakespeare started to write between 1589 and 1591 but we can't find a clear understanding of how he started his career. Hamlet

Hamlet was published in 1603. Hamlet is a tragic story out of the 3 genres: tragedy, comedy and history. A famous quote in Hamlet is, "To be or not to be." Hamlet's speech 'To be or not to be' is about morality and whether it's better to live or die.

The Globe theatre

William Shakespeare built the Globe theatre. It was built in 1599 and held up to 3000 people! The Globe theatre was called 'the play house' meaning the house that they performed plays in. The globe theatre was reconstructed due to it being very old. Every play was only played by men, so all women's parts were played by men. Also in the theatre there was a place you stood which was called ground-lings and that was the cheapest place to stand. So the top stand areas were more expensive. The modern day Shakespeare globe is actually a reconstruction of the actual thing. The globe theatre got its name after the figure of Hercules carrying the globe on his back.
