Class 4



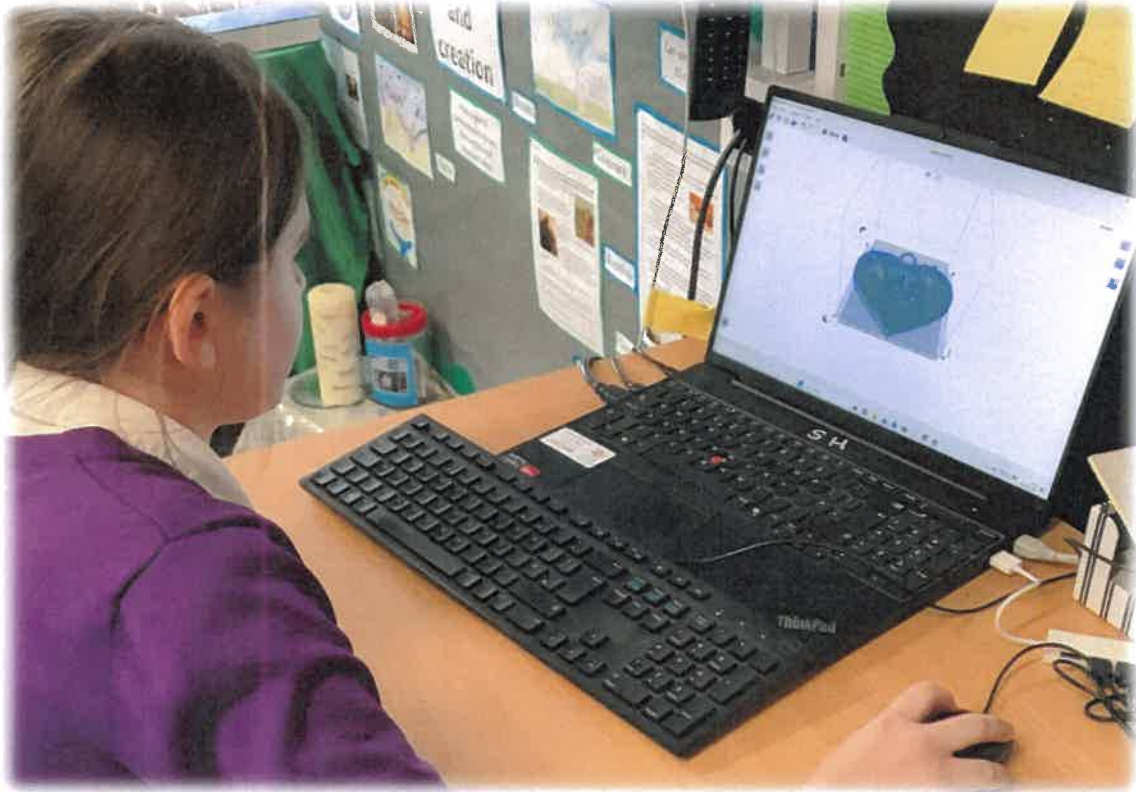

3D printing in class 5

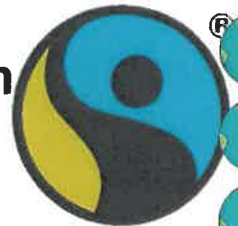

Definition:

When was it founded?

The modern fair-trade movement began in 1946 when Edna Ruth Byler started importing and selling Puerto Rican handicrafts through the Mennonite Central Committee (eventually becoming Ten Thousand Villages).

How many people have helped fair trade?

Fairtrade supports dignity in the workplace by guaranteeing over 2 million farmers and workers across more than 70 countries fair wages, safe working conditions, and the right to rest.
